

ABOUT THE NOVEMBER GENERAL ELECTION

What is the November Election?

The November General Election ELECTS the candidates that were nominated for the ballot during the Primary Election. These candidates are Federal, State and Local representatives. There may be referendums, and Special Elections on your ballot.

Who Can Vote in the November Election?

All voters that have registered by the voter registration deadline, or have been registered and found to be eligible can vote in the November Election.

Why is Voting in the November Election Important?

Voting in the November Election allows the voters to elect the official candidates that were nominated in the Primary Election. Candidates who won the Primary Election will be listed on the General Election ballot, along with other party nominees and candidates that are running as Independent Candidates.

Sometimes, a particular contest may only have one candidate. This means that the office is determined in the Primary Election. The candidate must still appear on the November General Election ballot to be officially elected. Voting in the November General Election ensures voters have a say in who represents them.
